INTRODUCTION FROM THE CHAIR.

With more than a thousand pharmacist-led travel vaccinations clinics in the UK, more and more pharmacists are involved in providing travel health advice or related clinical services. There is a vast diversity in the levels of practice, which has motivated a group of experienced pharmacist travel medicine clinicians to form a forum/group to discuss and formulate current best practice in travel health and medicine in the context of a pharmacy setting.

This conference aims to be a platform for pharmacist travel health clinicians to share best practices and equip experts in the travel health field with the knowledge and experience to deal with complex clinical cases and run a busy travel clinic operation.

In this series of lectures, you will find experts in Travel Medicine and Health across the different practice sectors: community, hospital and specialist centres.

Digital Travel Health & How to set up your Travel Clinic Day

In the morning of Day One, we will form a tutorial-style conference entitled 'Digital Travel Health and How To Set Up Your Travel Clinic'. This half-day workshop aims to provide an insight into technological innovations in the administrative and business side of the Travel Health sector in an informal parliamentary-style discussion and workshop group, led by frontline leaders in the movement of digitalising Travel Health technology in pharmacy settings. The anticipated outcome of this workshop is to formulate a well-organised and structured clinic which complies with regulatory requirements and standards. We will also cross-reference with other competency standards on travel clinic premises and with the clinicians from the medical practitioners and nursing professions.

Travel Medicine Cup 2018

In the afternoon of Day One, for the first time, we will hold the Travel Medicine Cup 2018 tournament for all health care professionals. This is a University Challenge-style competition which aims to provide a platform where the most knowledgeable travel health practitioners compete to win the title of 'Best Travel Vaccination in the UK on Clinical Knowledge'. We believe such healthy competition will raise awareness regarding best practice in travel medicine among health care professionals as a medical speciality and by extension, among the general public who are in need of travel health advice prior to travel. It will be a fun and innovative experience for travel health practitioners to demonstrate their knowledge and clinical experiences.

Expert Travel Medicine Conference 2018

Day Two will mark the most important part of the conference, the 'Expert Travel Medicine Conference Day', with 11 Travel Medicine and Health experts across the UK and overseas. Each expert speaker will speak for 25 minutes, sharing their years of experience in clinical practice to improve the knowledge and practice of pharmacist travel health practitioners.

It is the organising committee's hope that through active sharing of best practice among pharmacist specialist travel health practitioners, together with our friends from medical and nursing professions, we will create the gold standard practice among all travel vaccinations and immunisations clinic in the UK.

In the last 15 years the changing role of the pharmacist has accelerated rapidly to place the profession and practitioners in a situation where the movement has been away from the generalist role to a series of specialisms. When pharmacists were first allowed to administer the flu vaccine then it was a matter of time that those skills were to be utilised in provision of other vaccinations, and naturally travel health in pharmacies evolved.

Today there are over thousand pharmacist led travel health services providing a wide spectrum of services from the simple supply of anti-malarials through to full time specialists working in private clinics. At the same time the traditional suppliers of the travel health services, the primary healthcare providers have been reducing the supply of services in line with national health service policies. These suppliers having previous experience of training and educating in travel health defined the standards that all professionals are judged.

Along with the rapid expansion of pharmacy-led travel health services is the need to have clinical standards, which are the consistent for all professions providing the same service. Currently pharmacists remain outside the scope of CQC inspection standards for clinical services, however with the forthcoming changes in healthcare professional regulations then this will change. There is an increasing need for a set of defined clinical standards and competencies for pharmacists in the supply of travel health services. Ultimately these will support and enhance pharmacy by gaining acceptance from other professions and improving the safety to patients.

As a profession we currently do not have any mandated specialist standards in the provision of travel health services. Therefore the reliance is upon the individual to assess and demonstrate their professional competence through attendance at Conferences such as these.

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS:

The conference will begin with an address from Group Captain Green, the immediate past dean of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow Faculty of Travel Medicine, defence consultant adviser on infectious disease and one of the Queen's personal physicians. Group Captain Green will present the diagnostics test used by travel clinics.

Group Captain Green will be followed by Professor David Ross, Director of Education of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow Faculty of Travel Medicine Education board. His presentation will be on preparing volunteers and an advance risk assessment skills update on the psychological aspects of advanced travel clinics.

Then Alex Leung, Head of Travel Medicine, a specialist independent prescriber at five General Practices and pharmacies, and a board member of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow (RCPSG) Faculty of Travel Medicine Education Board (FTMEB), will present the methods on how to hold a child during vaccinations in the context of Panic Adult and Child and Moving Infant. I will use my own real-life experiences in this area to demonstrate how to deal with them. This will be useful for pharmacists who have to deal with the paediatric level of vaccinations.

Immediate past Dean of the Faculty of Travel Medicine, Royal College of Physician and Surgeon of Glasgow and Defence Consultant Adviser in Communicable Disease.

Gp Capt Andy Green trained at St George's Hospital Medical School, London and joined the Royal Air Force in 1983 after house jobs. He trained as a specialist in Clinical Microbiology, and was appointed Consultant Microbiologist in 1991.

He is currently Defence Consultant Adviser in Communicable Diseases, and advises the Surgeon General on all aspects of infectious diseases and their control, including biological warfare. Gp Capt Green sits on a number of national and international committees, both military and civilian. He has

published over 100 scientific articles, and has research interests in Travel Medicine and disease transmission on-board aircraft. In 2009, he was appointed Director of Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) with a remit to lead the development of IPC practice across the Defence Medical Services, and moved to his current position at the Royal Centre for Defence Medicine in Birmingham.

During the summer of 2014 he became one of the Military leads advising on clinical aspects of the Ebola Virus Disease (EVD) response of the United Kingdom.

He continues to act as a specialist adviser to the Department of Health and the World Health Organization on transportation of patients with highly transmissible infectious diseases. He was appointed as Dean of the Faculty of Travel Medicine in October 2015.

David Ross was commissioned into the Royal Army Medical Corps in 1983 and graduated in medicine from St Bartholomew's Hospital, London in 1986. In 2012 he was appointed the Parkes Professor of Preventive Medicine and in 2014 an Honorary Queen's Physician.

He has been associated with MASTA, a travel medicine provider, circa 2005 and from 2012 has been their Consultant Medical Advisor. Recent travel medicine research interests have included malaria prevention and tuberculosis screening. David is also Deputy Chief Examiner of the Diploma in Medical Care of Catastrophes at the Society of Apothecaries and an examiner at the UK Faculty of Public Health. He is married with two children, Verity & Cameron who occupy a large amount of his time outside work. Other interests in addition to travel include good food and wine, and sport (sadly mainly in an armchair capacity now!)

Alex is the Chair of the first Pharmacists Travel Medicine Conference 2018 with the aim of enhancing the clinical expertise of travel clinic pharmacists. He is a keen advocate for training pharmacists to provide sound, evidence-based Travel Health advice while working to a comprehensive risk assessment process.

Alex believes the sharing of practical experiences of frontline clinicians and Travel Medicine experts will inspire fellow pharmacists to progress to become advanced Travel Health/Travel Medicine clinicians. This is the purpose of the Travel Medicine conference.

Alex is a Fellow of the Royal Society for Public Health and is



interested in global health issues within the context of Travel Medicine. Alex is also a Specialist Pharmacist Independent Prescriber and has been serving as a frontline Travel Health clinician for more than seven years. He is the Head of Travel Medicine and Allergy Services at five GP surgeries and pharmacies and the Chief Pharmacist for Shell UK, working with the Shell Occupational Health team in improving clinical services.

Alongside his daily duties, Alex has been working on multiple projects with the goal of raising awareness regarding the importance of Travel Medicine services and its educational need in both the UK and Hong Kong.

Alex is a board member of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow (RCPSG) Faculty of Travel Medicine Education Board (FTMEB) and is tasked, along with fellow board members, to work with the Royal Pharmaceutical Society (RPS) to set the competencies framework of pharmacists' travel health clinicians and the clinical standards of pharmacy travel clinics in the UK.

Alex is the president (Overseas Affairs & Global Engagement) and co-founder of the Hong Kong Society of Travel Medicine (HKSTM), which aims to raise the public's awareness of the importance of Travel Health for Hong Kong and China travellers. Alex is an advocate for the empowerment of Hong Kong (HK) pharmacist professionals to become trained vaccinators, providing influenza vaccinations utilising skilled healthcare professionals.

Alex is also the education director of a PGD-accredited training course on travel vaccinations, seasonal influenza and injection techniques. To date, he has educated more than 1,400 UK pharmacists in this field. He is a qualified First Aid & Resuscitation Training Instructor, including First Aid At Work (FAAW) and an AED and Paediatric/Childcare First Aid Instructor, providing paediatric and adult CPR anaphylaxis courses.

After lunch, Group Captain Green, Honorary President of the Hong Kong Society of Travel Medicine (HKSTM) together with Dr Tommy Tang, President of HKSTM (Hong Kong Affairs) and Alex Leung, President of HKSTM (Overseas Affairs & Global Engagements) will host a brief commencement ceremony for the Hong Kong Society of Travel Medicine, marking its first page of history in raising the awareness of the health care professions and the public on travel medicine and health-related matters.

Dr Tommy Tang, an associate consultant in Infectious diseases, will present the post-travel/return traveller and tropical diseases and their signs, symptoms and diagnoses. It will be impactful if pharmacists can understand more of the post-travel diagnostics tests and how they correlate with advice given to patients pre-travel.

After Dr Tang, Dr George Kassianos, the President of British Global and Travel Health Association (BGTHA), an experienced GP in Travel Health and the National Immunisation Clinical Lead of RCPGP, will present 'National Flu Immunisation priorities: Over 65. Why adjuvanted trivalent flu vaccine (aTIV)? A perspective from the National Immunisation Clinical Lead.' It will clear up a lot of the mystery surrounding PHE advice aTIV for the over-65s and answer many pharmacists' question on whether it is suitable to use the Quadrivalent influenza vaccine (QIV) on an elderly population.

After the final break, Ms Emley Pine, a travel health specialist nurse and clinical lead in education and training for the Nomad travel clinic, will present 'At-Risk Travellers: Pregnancy and Breastfeeding'. Emley has vast experience in dealing with at-risk patients travelling to high-risk countries and what, as a travel health practitioner, the rationales and parameters are in aiding the formulation of advice or decisions regarding these special travellers.

Finally, Professor Larry Goodyer, professor of Pharmacy Practice at the University of De Montfort School of Pharmacy, the Chairperson of British Global and Travel Health Association (BGTHA), will give his expert opinion to pharmacists on how to support patients to find suitable insect repellents, especially for infants and patients with skin sensitivities.

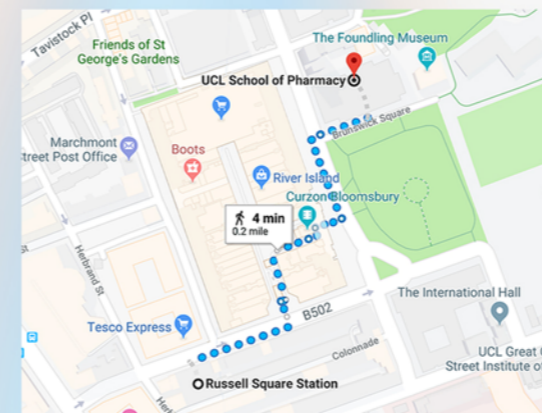
